La Casa is among 20 visual arts and arts education programs in the community to be awarded a total of \$338,000 in funding from the fund. Established by late local artist Mary L. Nohl, the fund has made grants of more than \$7 million since 2001 in support of arts in the metropolitan area.

> The school currently offers 4K and 5K, and plans to continue expanding its classes, with the ultimate goal of serving students up to eighth grade.

> The addition — which would extend north along Caroline Street - would add 11,504 square feet to the existing building.

> The plan is to build 12 additional classrooms during the multiphase expansion, with construction planned to begin this fall and be completed in time for the 2017-18 school year.
